For the effective planning and implementation of the curriculum, the college undertakes various steps, such as preparing a comprehensive curricular and co-curricular activities calendar with necessary working committees to implement the same. Our college ascertains that the objectives of curriculum are achieved within instant goal of providing quality education. The college ensures that, the objective of curriculum is imparted through innovative teaching methods such as PPTs, Seminars, Assignments, Group discussions, Mock interviews, Workshops, Outreach Programs, Usage of Wi-Fi facility, Library etc. The syllabus is completed as per the norms of the University and to the satisfaction of the students. For effective transaction of the curriculum, the college organizes various student enrichment programs. The feedback from the students is obtained both orally. Students are categorized as advanced learners and slow learners. Remedial classes are arranged to help the slow learners to cope up with the rigorous teaching learning process and to make credible academic progress. The quality of a teacher is also assured by recharging the faculty members in their own discipline as well as general professional competence through training programs and Faculty Development Programs both in and outside of the college. The library has computer facility with Wi-Fi connection which assist faculty and students about information on selected topics, new arrivals and also previous question papers are maintained for students' reference and to prepare for the exams.
